POSITION: Research Fellow – 1 post

ABOUT THE CENTRE:

The Centre for Constitutional Law, Policy and Governance works on foregrounding rights, rightslessness, and other vulnerabilities in understanding, critiquing, and reforming laws, legal institutions, and modes of governance, so that they reflect the constitutional ideals of justice. The Centre works with governmental and non-governmental organizations on various research and policy initiatives. The Centre for Constitutional Law, Policy and Governance, NLU Delhi is seeking to hire a Research Fellow for the Centre for the “**CLPG-CRR Project.**” Details of the position advertised are as follows:

ABOUT THE PROJECT:

The Centre for Constitutional Law, Policy, and Governance, and the Center for Reproductive Rights, New York, are collaborating to publish a “Manual on Reproductive Rights.” The aim of the manual is to provide a reference book for adjudicators, practitioners and students on important reproductive rights decisions, laws and international instruments. Covering a range of topics, the book seeks to provide both a compilation of important judgments on each issue, as well as a brief critical overview of the decisions, to enable readers to locate the decisions within the framework of rights. The manual will have as its primary audience adjudicators who are called upon to decide reproductive rights cases. In addition, the manual will be of use to practitioners and students alike as a ready reckoner on issues relating to reproductive rights.

ROLE OF THE RESEARCH FELLOW:

The Research Fellow will work with the Directors of the Centre in producing the manual, the conceptualization and research for which has been completed. Work will involve reviewing and editing materials already put together, providing and reviewing head notes of cases, and providing a critical overview of the development of law in that particular area, with the aim of locating the decisions within the broad context of a rights based approach to reproduction. The Fellow will also be required to supervise the work of student researchers working on the project, assist the Directors in organizing events/workshops/conferences around the project and any other activities associated with the project. The Fellow will also be expected to participate in other activities of the Centre, and undertake administrative responsibilities and institution building exercises at the Centre.

QUALIFICATIONS:

Applications are invited from interested candidates holding an undergraduate or post-graduate degree in law. Candidates with demonstrable proficiency in issues relating to gender/reproductive rights will be preferred. Strong research and writing skills are essential. Note that this is an entry-level position and would be ideal for individuals with 0-2 years PQE.

DURATION & REMUNERATION:

The Fellow will be paid a monthly salary of Rs. 50,000 per month. The position will be for a period of three months, but is likely to be extended by another year subject to procuring additional funds. Candidates should therefore apply only if they are available for the position for the entire duration. The selected candidate will be expected to join the Centre as soon as possible, and in no case later than August 6, 2018.

PROCEDURE FOR APPLYING:

Interested applicants are required to send the following materials to the Executive Director, Centre for Constitutional Law, Policy and Governance at clpg@nludelhi.ac.in. The subject-line of the e-mail should state: Application for CLPG-CRR Project.

1. Curriculum Vitae
2. Contact Details of Two Referees. Referees must be informed that they may be contacted by CLPG either over email or by phone.
3. One sole authored academic writing sample (Published or unpublished).

Shortlisted candidates may be asked for additional material. Shortlisted candidates will be called for an interview, which they may attend in person or over video-conferencing. NLU Delhi or CLPG will not cover the costs for attending the interview. The last date for receiving applications is **Wednesday, July 11, 2018**.

Due to the volume of applications that we generally receive, it will not be possible to notify each applicant of the status of their application. E-mails will be sent only to shortlisted candidates.
